It all starts with “A Date”.....

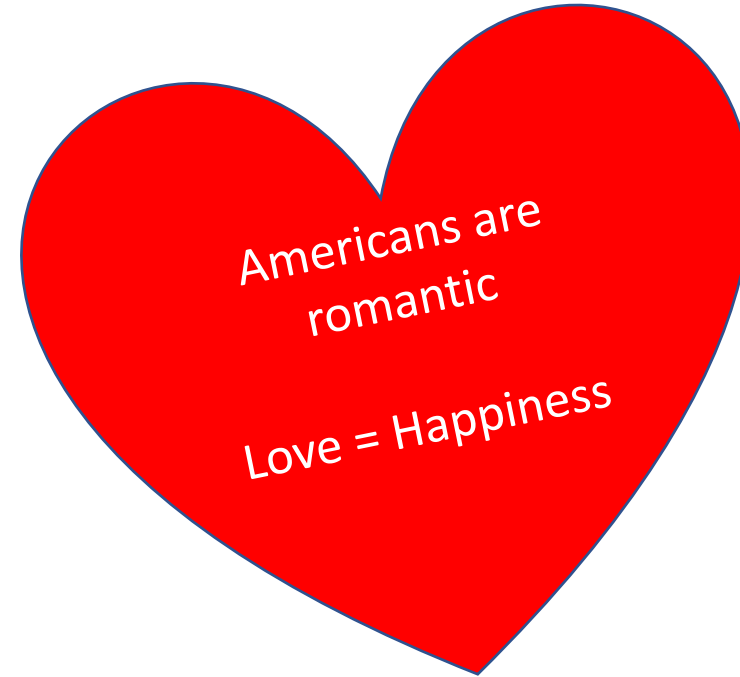
“A Date” - **two people** agree to go out together (do an activity)

“A Date” is NOT about friendship!



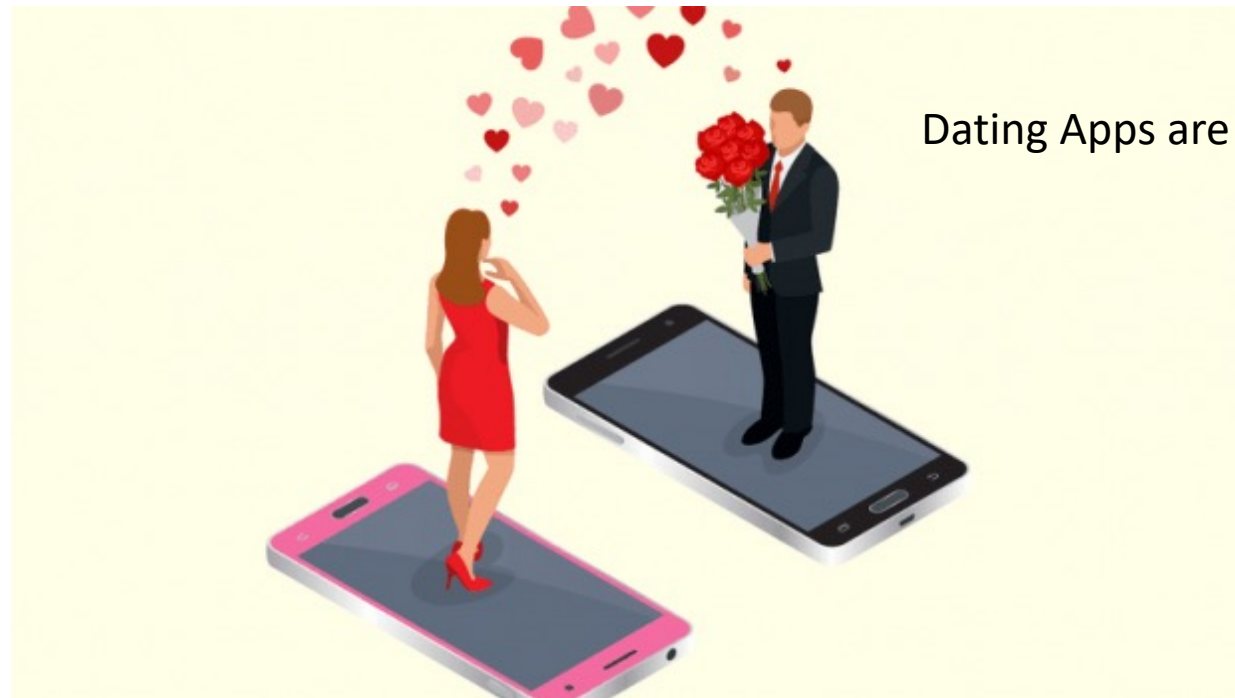
Purpose: looking for love!

- Parents and family not involved

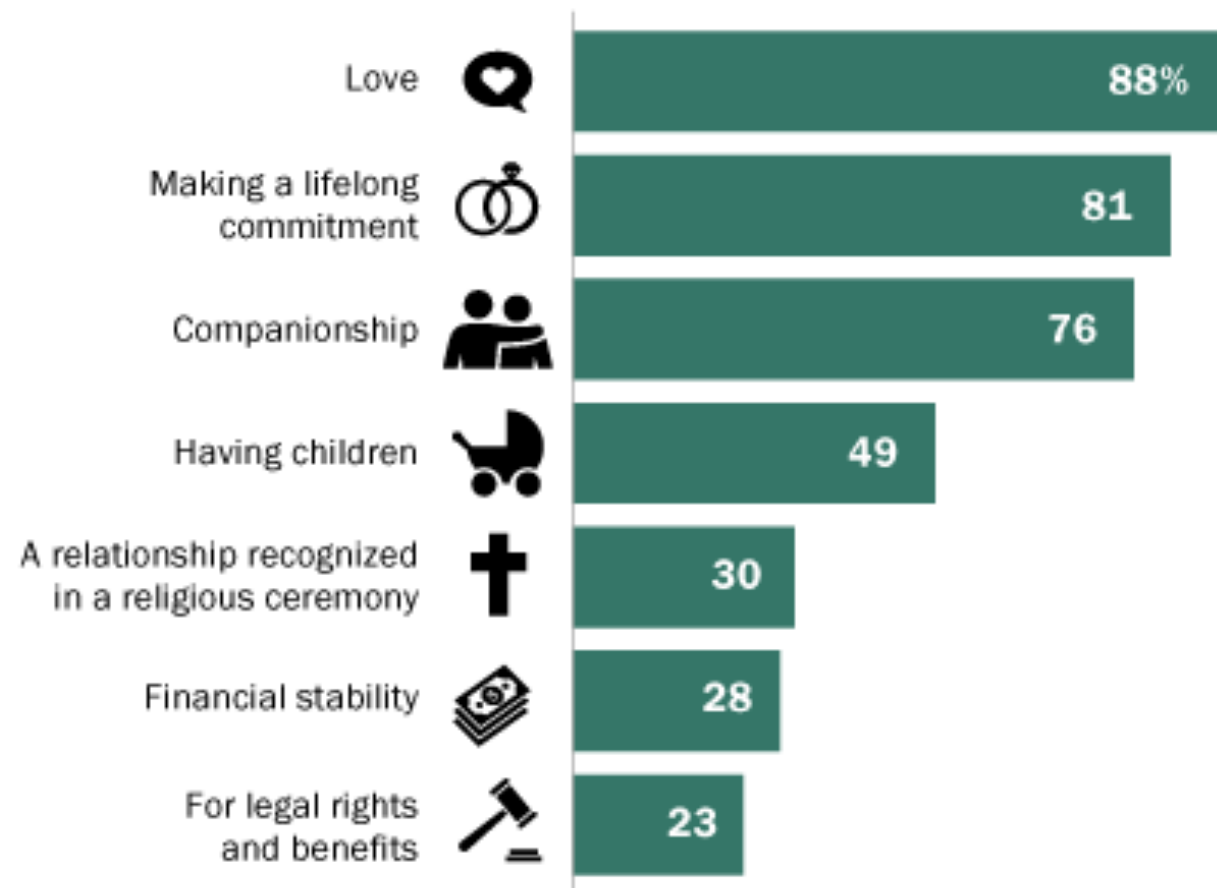


Dating Apps are super popular!



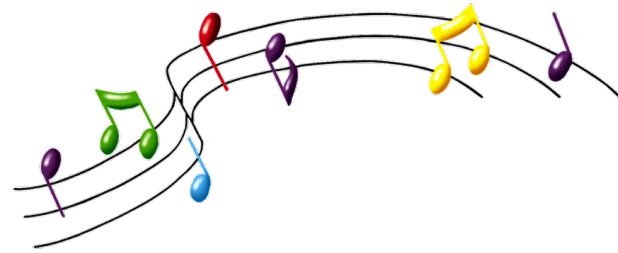
Why get married?

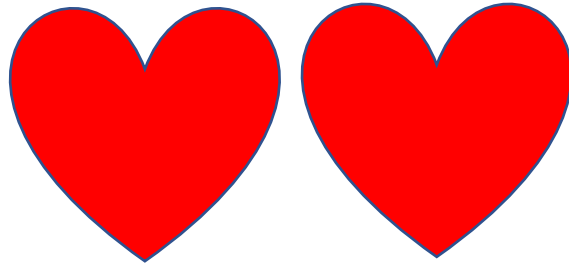
